

Application Procedure

1. Return the fully completed application to the Admission Office with a non-refundable \$35 application fee.
2. Request official transcripts from all colleges you have attended. Transcripts must be mailed directly to Sherman College from the school of origin.
3. Include lab documentation to verify your lab experience in all science courses in which less than four semester hours of credit were earned per course. A course description from a college catalog is sufficient.

*NOTE: Application is made only for the term specified on the application form. If a student wishes to postpone enrollment, he or she must notify the Admission Office.

As a candidate for admission, each applicant is evaluated individually and admitted to the college on the basis of motivation, scholastic achievement, and an honest desire to join a health care profession. In making its decision, the Sherman College Admission Committee reviews each applicant's academic credentials and personal references.

Sherman College admits only applicants who meet all the qualifications for a chiropractic education. Every candidate for admission is given serious consideration and notified of the decision of the college's Admission Committee once the admission process is complete.

WHEN TO APPLY:

As class size is limited, applicants are advised to submit their application as early as possible to assure a place in the enrolling class of their choice. Doing this will automatically place the student on the college's mailing list to be advised of all updates to the Bulletin and to receive various Sherman College publications.

What is a Three Plus One?

In general, a *Three Plus One Agreement* with Sherman College allows a student to earn a baccalaureate degree from the undergraduate institution while *simultaneously* completing classes towards the doctor of chiropractic degree.

The program consists of three years of pre-chiropractic studies at the undergraduate institution and one year of chiropractic studies at Sherman College. Once you have satisfied the prerequisites for admission to Sherman College and the required core courses for the degree at the undergraduate institution, you would then transfer to Sherman College. After successful completion of the designated courses in the first year at Sherman College, the undergraduate institution accepts those hours in transfer and awards the baccalaureate degree. **This saves you a full year of time and tuition!**

Upon successful completion of all courses at Sherman College, you will receive a Doctor of Chiropractic (DC) degree.

The Three Plus One Program 2009-2010

This agreement is designed to facilitate student transfer from selected four-year institutions to Sherman College of Chiropractic for students desiring Bachelor of Arts (BA) or Bachelor of Science (BS) and Doctor of Chiropractic (DC) degrees.

It allows a student to earn a baccalaureate degree from the undergraduate institution while simultaneously completing classes towards the doctor of chiropractic degree.

Admissions Information

Sherman College of Chiropractic will guarantee admission to students from select four-year institutions who meet the following provisions:

1. Students must have successfully completed the prescribed curriculum of the Three Plus One Agreement and must have satisfied residency and general education requirements at selected 4-year undergraduate institution.
2. No grade below "C" will be accepted for transfer to selected 4-year institution. No grade below "C" in core courses will be accepted for transfer to Sherman.
3. Students must have earned a minimum 2.7* cumulative grade point average and a minimum 2.5 grade point average in the core courses required for admission to Sherman College.
4. Students will be granted tentative acceptance upon completion of a minimum 45 semester hours with final acceptance granted upon receipt of the student's final transcript from selected 4-year undergraduate institution.
5. Students who successfully complete all courses in the first four quarters at Sherman College will be granted the BA or BS Degree from selected 4-year undergraduate institution.

* The minimum cumulative grade point average requirement will be increased by one-tenth of a point each year, until the required entering cumulative GPA reaches 3.0 in April 2012.

Financial Aid

Financial aid is available for students in this program. Sherman College administers federal student aid funds for the Perkins Loan and College Work-Study programs. In addition, Sherman College is an eligible institution for students receiving loans under the provisions of the subsidized and unsubsidized Stafford Loan Program, ChiroLoan, the Veterans Administration (including the Yellow Ribbon Program for Post-9/11 Veterans), the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Vocational Rehabilitation and Social Security.
