

Sherman College Tour Guide Program

Tour guides for Sherman College are a vital part of the admission process because they give prospective students the opportunity to see the campus from a student's point of view. Tours are offered daily with the option to tailor the tour to suit the needs of each prospective student. The tour itself typically lasts one hour with additional time spent with admissions, financial aid, classroom observation and meeting with the president or other administrator. We also depend on tour guides to participate in career events like Career Day at Lyceum and Pride of Sherman Tour as well as on-line chats.

Students must be at least 2nd quarter before they can begin giving tours and they have to shadow two tours given by veteran tour guides before they can give a solo tour. On their first solo tour, they are shadowed by a veteran guide or admission office representative to ensure all the pertinent material is covered. Students earn two lunch certificates to the Spine Dining Café for each tour they give.
