

Position Title: Case Doctor for Sports Outreach

Primary Function: The Case Doctor for Sports Outreach will lead the development and

management of a comprehensive sports chiropractic program that aligns with the college mission and values. The program will collaborate with local athletic departments and organizations to provide chiropractic care to athletes. This role involves collaboration with athletic organizations, supervision of chiropractic interns and the promotion of chiropractic care

within sports health and performance.

Key Responsibilities:

- 1. Develop and oversee the sports chiropractic program, ensuring alignment with the college's mission and standards for patient care and clinical education.
- 2. Establish partnerships with local athletic departments, sports teams and organizations to provide chiropractic care to athletes.
- 3. Collaborate with athletic trainers, coaches and other healthcare professionals to integrate chiropractic care into sports health programs.
- 4. Collaborate with the Offices of Admission and Institutional Advancement to develop perspective student recruitment opportunities and build community relationships.
- 5. Assist in the preparation of the annual program budget, including equipment, supplies and other resources necessary for program implementation.
- 6. Formulate and enforce policies and procedures for the sports chiropractic program, ensuring compliance with all relevant regulations.
- 7. Serve as the primary clinical supervisor for chiropractic students participating in the sports chiropractic program.
- 8. Oversee student assessments, performance evaluations and provide feedback to support professional development in sports chiropractic care.

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- 9. Develop and deliver lectures, workshops and hands-on training sessions related to sports chiropractic care.
- 10. Perform all duties essential to being a chiropractic center case doctor.
- 11. Assist in faculty scheduling, ensuring adequate coverage for clinical supervision and instruction.
- 12. Promote and support research in sports chiropractic, including the development of research initiatives and collaboration with faculty, students and external partners.
- 13. Advocate for the role of chiropractic care for the purpose of improving athletic performance at local, regional, and national conferences, panels, and events.
- 14. Participate in activities that enhance personal and professional growth related to sports chiropractic.
- 15. Set annual professional goals aligned with the college's objectives, contributing to the program's growth and development.
- 16. Maintain any certifications or licenses necessary for program leadership and clinical practice.
- 17. Submit routine reports to the dean of clinics on program performance, student outcomes and community impact.
- 18. Engage actively in shared governance of the college by participating in Faculty Senate and other college committees.
- 19. Support college policies and collaborate with employees to promote a cohesive and productive academic environment.
- 20. Participate in college events, including commencement exercises, faculty meetings and other required activities.
- 21. Play an active role in promoting and supporting perspective student recruitment through sports chiropractic venues.
- 22. Lend enthusiastic support to college policies and to fellow co-workers.
- 23. Participate in the annual Lyceum program.
- 24. Demonstrate commitment to the mission of Sherman College.

Essential Knowledge and Skills:

1. Strong understanding of sports chiropractic principles and their application in clinical education as framed by Sherman College.

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- 2. Doctor of Chiropractic (DC) degree from an accredited institution.
- 3. Current South Carolina chiropractic license.
- 4. Minimum of 5 years of clinical experience in sports chiropractic, with at least 3 years of teaching or leadership experience.
- 5. Proven ability to build partnerships with athletic departments and sports organizations.
- 6. Strong organizational, communication and leadership skills.

Physical Demands and Work Environment:
